



## Safeguarding Position Assessment for Expected Level of Contact with Children and Young People

This tool is designed to help assess positions for the expected level of contact with children and young people and to help determine the appropriate safeguarding recruitment process to follow.

The assessment is completed by determining the level of contact the position will have working with children and young people based on the context of the role as listed below. The level the position falls within, will determine the safeguarding documents and processes that should be completed
